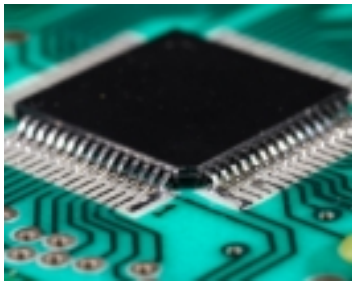
Updated hunting and game breeding guidance



Hunting, shooting and game businesses can cause emissions from incinerators, noise pollution from dogs and shooting, or water pollution from contaminated run-off from yards. Find out what hunting, shooting and game businesses must do to reduce their impact.



Updated machinery and electricals guidance



Our updated machinery and electrical equipment guidance can help businesses manage the hazardous substances used in manufacturing or servicing equipment, understand how to dispose of electrical components, and ensure they have the right permits.

Protocol sees waste ash used for aggregate



Pulverised fuel ash (PFA) and furnace bottom ash (FBA) used according to a new quality protocol to produce aggregates for uses such as grout and breeze blocks are no longer classed as waste, so waste controls won't apply. The protocol launched this week in England, Northern Ireland and Wales could keep

300,000 tonnes of PFA and FBA out of landfill per year.

Are you prepared for flooding?



Being prepared for a flood may help to reduce financial losses, damage to property and business interruption. A national flood exercise in March 2011, Exercise Watermark, will test responses to severe flooding across England and Wales. Get involved and be prepared.
